The nursing profession is a physically demanding job that involves excessive manual handling of patients. This results in the nurses being susceptible to musculoskeletal disorders. Discussion. The high prevalence of musculoskeletal disorders among nurses is thought to be due to physical work demands, as well as to work organizational factors, of which scheduling is an important component [28, 30, 31]. However, there is a dearth of studies on WMSDs among nurses in Nigeria. Musculoskeletal disorders are one of the most common and costly occupational injuries. Nursing profession, considering the nature of the work, is one of the occupations in hospital in which work-related musculoskeletal disorders are highly prevalent.
